Video editing software	Additional information
Windows Movie Maker	<p>This is one of the easiest video editing packages to use. It will allow you to create an exciting finished video product in less than an hour. This software, however, does not offer more advanced features such as control over audio.</p> <p>It comes free as part of Microsoft XP. It can also be downloaded free from Microsoft's download centre</p>
Adobe Premiere	<p>An excellent package that is sometimes referred to as the 'standard'. It has far more features than you would need for a simple video project. This, at times, makes it complicated for a novice user. You can download a free demo from Adobe</p>
Pinnacle Studio	<p>This is an excellent video editing package. Like Adobe's Premiere, though, it has more features than you really need. Therefore it may not be ideal for the first-time user. For more information, visit Pinnacle Systems' website.</p>
