What is a remote exam?

A remote exam is a piece of work you complete at home, or somewhere else you choose, over a short timescale. The location needs to have an internet connection and be quiet and uninterrupted so you can concentrate.

All Open University remote exams are designed to be completed in 3 hours, though you might have extra time to prepare and submit your answers.

You'll be able to access and refer to your module materials and the internet while completing your remote exam.

But you should focus on answering the questions as you won't have enough time to look everything up, especially if your exam has a fixed time limit.

Most remote exams don't have formal invigilation – you won't be required to have a camera or be on a video call with someone.

You submit electronically via your module website by either answering questions on screen or downloading a question paper and uploading and submitting answers.
