### Top Tips for Exam Revision and Preparation

Know what to expect, look at the specimen paper on your module website. This will help you to understand the exam format, how many questions you'll have to answer and whether any of them are compulsory. If they're available, have a look at past exam papers.

Check the date and time you will sit your exam – if it's remote or online, you'll need somewhere with internet access where you won't be interrupted. Make sure you've organised child or pet care, have everything you need before you log on and know how to get help if you have any problems.

Check for gaps in your knowledge and understanding. Decide which topics you might need to revise intensively and which ones you only need to review briefly.

Attend a revision session and check with your tutor about the key topics and issues to bear in mind when revising.

Look at how much time you have available and create a timetable. Plan ahead to fit your revision around your other responsibilities.

Prepare the notes and course materials you're going to use for revision.

Do the work! It's less stressful to revise than it is to worry about it.
