GUIDELINES FOR REOPENING OF EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS AND IMPLEMENTATION OF COVID-19 STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES (SOPs)

What is in this document?

- Guidelines for reopening education institutions
- Covid-19 Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)

Who should use it?

- Any staff working in education institutions in Uganda
- All PEAS staff with direct contact to school need to understand this guidance and how it will apply in our school contexts.

• Why is it important?

- Mitigation of the risk of transmission and spread of the disease
- To reduce Covid-19s impact on teaching and learning.



Overview of the Guidelines & SOPs

Key information:

Roles and responsibilities (section 7):

COVID-19 committee: 7 members, including 2 learners and a member of the support staff.

Each class/lecture room shall have a student monitor responsible for promoting compliance to Covid-19 control and safety measures

Each institution should appoint a member of staff from the committee to be a Community Liaison Officer (CLO).



Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)

What are the standards and operational procedures?

Section 5 of the SOPs provides a guide to help schools implement COVID 19 prevention standards and operational procedures at **critical control points** in schools.

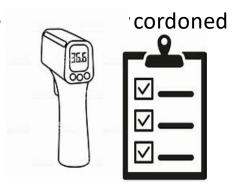
Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)

- Key interventions to stop the spread of Covid-19 in schools.
- The SOP provides ten overarching interventions to help stop the spread of COVID 19 in schools.
- a) Hand washing 20 sec, clean water
- b) Use of hand sanitisers 10 sec, 60% ABHR
- c) Social/physical distancing 2 metres
- **d) Ventilation and lighting** vents/windows open
- e) Disinfection/decontamination
- **f)** Respiratory etiquette use tissues etc.
- **g)** Safety and security restrict entry to schools
- h) Facial masks compulsory for all
- i) Waste management Dispose infected waste & water
- j) Orientation of teaching and non-teaching staff on COVID-19 SOPs



Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) cont'd

- Key interventions to monitor Covid-19 in schools.
- The SOP provides three interventions to monitor staff and students for signs of COVID 19 for prompt action, early detection and immediate referral.
- a) Daily monitoring of learners and staff for signs and symptoms of COVID 19 disease one member of staff responsible for monitoring and submitting daily summary to district task force.
- b) Management of persons meeting the Standard Care definition of COVID 19— school must have an isolation room to accommodate learners during district investigation, staff can be monitored at home.
- c) Management of schools with confirmed cases—all schools with confirmed cases will be off until all the contacts to the confirmed case are identified and listed.





Process to follow if staff/student has symptoms of COVID 19

What to do if:

- Staff/student displays symptoms of COVID 19.
- Staff/day student has family member at home with COVID 19 symptoms.

Quarantine

- Staff should be immediately sent home and student should be isolated in 'isolation room'
- Quarantine rules apply

Decontaminate

- All areas contacted by staff/student with COVID 19 symptoms should be decontaminated
- See SOP p.14 for decontamination requirements

Alert

- Alert district task team and district rapid response team
- District teams will manage persons under observation

Contact

 Compile list of people at school that potentially unwell person has had contact with All the four actions must be taken IMMEDIA TELY

If staff/student tests positive for COVID 19 school will be automatically closed by District Task Teams and further risk reduction measures taken. Schools will be disinfected and reopen after 21 days
