Time on Task

- 0.1 Teacher provides learning activity to most students
- 0.2 Students are on task

Quality of teacher's practices

Classroom culture

1. Supportive learning environment

- The teacher treats all students respectfully
- The teacher uses positive language with students
- The teacher responds to students' needs
- The teacher does not exhibit gender bias and challenges gender stereotypes in the classroom

2. Positive behavioural expectations

- The teacher sets clear behavioural expectations for classroom activities
- The teacher acknowledges positive student behaviour
- The teacher redirects misbehaviour and focuses on the expected behaviour, rather than the undesired behaviour

Instruction

3. Lesson facilitation

- The teacher explicitly articulates the objectives of the lesson and relates classroom activities to the objectives
- The teacher's explanation of content is clear
- The teacher makes connections in the lesson that relate to other content knowledge or students' daily lives
- The teacher models by enacting or thinking aloud

4. Checks for understanding

- The teacher uses questions, prompts or other strategies to determine students' level of understanding
- The teacher monitors most students during independent/group work
- The teacher adjusts teaching to the level of students

5. Feedback

- The teacher provides specific comments or prompts that help clarify students' misunderstandings
- The teacher provides specific comments or prompts that help identify students' successes

6. Critical thinking

- The teacher asks open-ended questions
- The teacher provides thinking tasks
- The student asks open-ended questions or performs thinking tasks

Socio-emotional skills

7. Autonomy

- Teacher provides students with choices
- Teacher provides students with opportunities to take on roles in the classroom
- Students volunteer to participate in the classroom

8. Perseverance

- Teacher acknowledges students' efforts rather than focusing only on results, students' intelligence, or natural abilities
- Teacher has a positive attitude toward student challenges
- Teacher encourages goal-setting

9. Social and collaborative skills

- The teacher promotes students' collaboration through peer-interaction
- The teacher promotes students' interpersonal skills
- Students collaborate with one another through peer interaction
