LITERACY: Listening and Talking

- Listen to the poem for enjoyment and discuss its meaning
- Why is the poem called the "international press"?
- Discuss the double meaning of the title and why it is effective
- Show understanding by answering literal, inferential and other kinds of questions regarding its content, structure and choice of vocabulary LIT 2-02a, 2-07a, 2-09a

NUMERACY

- Using the internet, or other sources, find out how much each food item mentioned in the poem would cost
- Add up the total cost of the "international press"? MNU 2-09a, -09b, -09c TCH 2-03b

SCIENCES: Planet Earth

- The items in the international press come from all over the world
- Calculate the "food miles" involved in bringing the various items from across the world to Shetland SCN 2-01a, -02a

SOCIAL STUDIES: People, Place and Environment

- Put stickers on a map of the world and a map of Shetland to show where all the food has come from
- Research the effect that the food miles covered by these journeys has on the environment
- Research the various different types of transport involved
- Is there anywhere on the map you've never heard of? Which places have you visited
- Research Fair Trade and some of the foods involved in the poem SOC 2-08a, 2-09a, 2-10a, 2-16a, 2-20a
