Finding a Language OER

How to search for a language OER.

Preliminary steps:

- **Filtering:** When you find a large number of resources, you can narrow your search by applying filters such as type, date, length, and duration of the resource. Then choose those resources that fit your learning goals.
- **Finding alternatives:** Search for various alternative OERs until you find the most suitable one for your teaching and learning objectives.
- **Using Google:** Try to find openly licensed content and material. The advanced search feature in Google allows you to filter results by usage rights.

Are there any language OER repositories?

There are many OER repositories related to language education, as well as repositories that include a rich variety of OERs in several subjects, including language. A list of useful OER databases for language learning can be found in the OpenLang Network Digital Toolkit.

Any useful tips?

- Use OER meta finders—specialized OER search engines that can help you find open educational resources more easily.
- Use the Directory of Open Access Repositories to locate open educational repositories efficiently.
